Section 1. The total maximum transfer from the rural basic fund to the secondary road fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020 shall not exceed the sum of \$1,246,412.00 and the total maximum transfer from the general basic fund to the secondary road fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020 shall not exceed the sum of \$103,718.00.

Section 2. Within 30 days of being notified of the appointment of current property taxes, state replacements against levied property taxes, mobile home taxes, military service tax credit replacements, or livestock credit replacements to the general basic or rural services basic funds, the Auditor shall order a transfer from said fund to the secondary road fund.

Section 3. The amount of the transfer required by Section 2 shall be equal to the apportionment made under Section 2 to the general basic or rural services basic fund, respectively, multiplied by the ratio of said fund's total maximum transfer to the secondary road fund, to the sum of said fund's total current property tax levy, total mobile home taxes, total military service tax credit replacements, and total livestock credit replacements.
