REIMBURSEMENT FROM THE IOWA **COVID-19 GOVERNMENT RELIEF** FUND 09-01-2020-02-01

A resolution by Winnebago County to request reimbursement for eligible costs related to the COVID-19 public health emergency from the Iowa COVID-19

Government Relief Fund. WHEREAS, the United States Congress approved the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act

to provide economic relief related to the COVID-19 pandemic,

WHEREAS, Governor Kim Reynolds allocated \$125 million of the State of lowa's CARES Act funding to local governments for direct expenses incurred in response to the COVID-19 emergency.

WHEREAS, local government funding reimbursements may only be used for necessary expenditures incurred due to the COVID-19 pandemic, were not accounted for in the current fiscal year county budget, were incurred during the time period of March 1, 2020 through December 30, 2020 and have not been reimbursed from other sources.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RE-SOLVED, Winnebago County requests reimbursement of \$131,268.09 in eligible expenditures in response to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Winnebago County affirms that the above requests for reimbursement follow all formal published Federal and State of Iowa guidance on how the funds should be spent, and understand if the reimbursements are misrepresented, the local government will be liable for any applicable penalty and interest.
